The Legion has also been the main contributor to the Battle Back Centre at Lilleshall as part of its commitment to support wounded, injured and sick personnel.

It is a sad fact that we have lost several members recently. Many people don't realize that you don't have to have been a member of the Armed Services to join. It would be good to have some new members with new ideas for raising money to support this worthwhile cause. So far this year Cleobury has contributed over £6830.

The branch meets on the 2nd Wednesday of the month at the Bell Inn. The branch organizes trips to various museums, the National Arboretum and the Birmingham Tattoo.
