UPDATE ON SMARTWATER

Discussion about what to do with the 250 packs left Matt is actively looking at selling these for the price purchased -possibly to Kinlet PC who are looking at becoming a Smartwater village too

Approx 40 new residents have moved in since Smartwater was delivered, volunteers offered to deliver packs to them

ACTION Matt to co-ordinate with volunteers

DECISION MADE TO KEEP THE REMAINING PACKS FOR NEW RESIDENTS AND TO BE MINDFUL OF SELL BY DATES AND KEEP SWAPPING WITH POLICE AND SMARTWATER

There is a feeling in Far Forest that crime has been displaced to them from Cleobury following the Smartwater campaign

ACTION Matt to organise for Smartwater signs to be erected at Far Forest and Hopton

UPDATE ON CCTV

Cleobury Mortimer Parish Council agreed to pay an additional £3,025 which was the shortfall for the CCTV and covers the extra cameras.

Cameras will be positioned at:

- The Hurst
- Sports and Social Club
- Car Park
- Skate Park
- Play Area

ORP (contractors) to meet with church, fire and street lighting to agree on siting

CCTV should be up and running in August 2016

CCTV will not be monitored but will be recorded and images will be available to the police. Nominated volunteers to be key holders - Andrew Davies (Fire) and Jim Griffiths (Crime Group)

Still no response from Shropshire Council other take-over of the equipment ACTION Vic / Madge to chase on this

Geoff reminded the group that the signs and the cameras have to go up at the same time for them to be effective.

UPDATE FROM THE POLICE

Mobile Police Station:

working with Cyber Crime - funded by the Police Crime Commissioner and laid out like a police station ACTION Matt to arrange dates for it to be in Cleobury

Parking:

Concerns include parking on pavements, causing obstructions and yellow lining Suggestion that polite note from Crime Group is put on problem vehicles believed that the houses I the Bovis Estate have covenants stating nothing exceeding 3.5 tonnes

ACTION Matt to arrange for Parkright to make regular visits at differing times of the day and evening and to look at Bovis covenants ACTION Jim to include item in Clarion about patrols by Parkright over the summer

Speeding:

Concerns about:

- the Tenbury Road as no footpath
- speeding through the High Street
- pedestrian crossing – possibility of it becoming a puffin crossing (traffic lights)
- new crossing at Tuffins
- could the school help with posters about speeding?

ACTION Matt to speak to Glyn Shaw (Shropshire Council) and to make speeding the key agenda item for the next Crime Group meeting

ASB concerns:

Staff and customers of the Sports and Social club have been targeted with ASB as they leave the club

Insp Baker is looking for new areas for training of the dog and fire arm teams – the social club and surrounding areas would be ideal – this could make people aware of a police presence.

ACTION Jim to enquire about Special Constables availability for Cleobury.
