



Chair's Introduction

Vision for Cleobury 2036

We would like to remind you of our vision - developed at the Town Plan Meeting January 2018

- People of all ages live happily and enjoy a strong sense of community and the security that this brings
- There is a state of the art community hub that meets the needs of all sectors of the community
- ❖ The age profile of the community will be balanced because suitable housing will be available for people and families in all phases of their lives
- ❖ There is a well-connected public transport system that allows people of all ages and mobility to travel on foot or by bus on safe, convenient and direct routes
- Access to the beautiful countryside is available to all with good connections between rural and urban areas



Vision for Cleobury 2036 (continued)

- ❖ There is a prosperous local economy that meets the needs of the town and surrounding villages and that provides well-paid local jobs, including working from home
- The town centre is vibrant and meets the needs of local people so that they are not forced to travel long distances to access services
- Mental and physical health is good for all members of the community because there are ample opportunities to exercise, meet others, and obtain specialist support when it is required
- There is energy self-sufficiency and the opportunity to benefit from renewable sources of energy and cleaner energy including vehicle charging points
- Green spaces are improved and enhanced, and local trees of importance are protected.
- Tourists will visit and contribute to the local economy

Neighbourhood Plan 2020-36

- A Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) for Cleobury's Future is planned to go through both public consultation and a public referendum in the coming year. The referendum must achieve a simple majority public vote in order to become law and part of Shropshire's Local Plan.
- The NDP requires negotiation and agreement with landowners prepared to provide the land needed. This
 benefits local people as it includes important factors such as preserving Cleobury's heritage, meeting housing
 and business development needs, as well as providing and protecting new green space, trees, habitats and
 footpaths.
- The NDP will be widely consulted on and strives to balance the needs of existing residents, with the
 development needs of Cleobury Mortimer. The government set national housing development requirements
 for the country, which in turn Shropshire Council apply proportionately to different areas of the county,
 including Cleobury Mortimer. The NDP ensures the community needs drive the plan and we work
 constructively with landowners who make suitable land available for development.
- The plan is being developed by a broad based team of volunteers before it comes to the Town Council for adoption.
- Over the last 12 months we have been working with Shropshire Council planning and highways, landowners
 and external consultants. A proposed site on land off Ludlow Road has been allocated for further assessment.
 This meets community needs identified within the NDP for housing development, recreational land and
 additional cemetery space.
- Further land for business development is also identified for further assessment at New House Industrial Estate, Tenbury Road.



Cleobury Food Bank





Cleobury Food Bank was established in October 2019 to relieve food poverty and financial hardship in Cleobury Mortimer and the surrounding area. It is a collaborative project managed by the Town Council, St. Mary's Church and St. Elizabeth's Church. The Food Bank is open on Friday Mornings from 9.30 to 11.30 am and operates on the ground floor of the Market Hall in Church Street.

When comparing performance from 2020 to 2021 the Food Bank distributed as below:

Year	Adult parcels	Child parcels	Total
2020	281	249	530
2021	647	397	1044

This indicates an increase of Food Bank usage almost double the previous year, with the largest increase in adults (an increase of 130% - particularly single adult households). There were 37 new referrals in 2021.

Cleobury Food Bank (continued)



• The local community, neighbouring parishes, organisations and Churches have continued to be incredibly generous with donations of both food and cash throughout 2021. The Food Bank has their own dedicated Facebook page and provides regular posts giving information about which items are in short supply.

Several factors contributed to the financial pressures placed on households in 2021. They include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Covid-19 pandemic
- Benefit reductions
- Soaring energy costs
- Rising food costs

- Painting Market Hall and Cemetery railings.
- Refurbish High Street benches and bins.







