

- The Regulation 16 consultation was completed by Shropshire Council in March 2023 and an Independent Examiner was appointed in June 2023 to review the Neighbourhood Plan together with feedback from the public and statutory consultations.
- The Independent Examiner submitted their report to Shropshire Council in September 2023 and their recommended changes were made to the Neighbourhood Plan for final approval by Shropshire Council in October 2023.
- The Cleobury Mortimer Neighbourhood Plan was approved by Shropshire Council in October 2023 and Electoral Services arranged a referendum for December 2023 where residents of Cleobury Mortimer Parish, were asked – "Do you want Shropshire Council to use the Neighbourhood Plan for Cleobury Mortimer to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?"
- The result of the referendum was 84% in favour of the proposal and the Neighbourhood Development Plan for Cleobury Mortimer progressed to the final stage.
- Shropshire Council adopted the Neighbourhood Development Plan on 21st March 2024. The Plan now forms part of the Development Plan for Shropshire.
- We must express our thanks to the community volunteers who gave up so much of their time over the past 5 years to make this plan a reality!

 Tree Works – Following a detailed Arborists Survey, extensive work was undertaken within the QE11 Park, Playing Field, Love Lane Play Area, Cemetery and Churchyard. 
Inflation has impacted Council finances with increased charges for contractor service and utilities .

Financial breakdown 2021-2024








